

How to cite a printed text:

Author [Surname, initial]. (year of publication). Title: subtitle. Publisher, Place of publication.




If your source is a separate chapter or article within a book, you can put the title of the article/chapter in quotation marks before the italicised title.

Example:

Brown, D. (1978). "Significant people". *The Bodley Head Archaeologies: Anglo-Saxon England*. Penguin Publishing, Sydney, pp123-145.

How to cite a website:

Author [surname, initial]. (date). Title of website. Retrieved, Month date, year from website address



Some websites don't have a date or an author. If they don't, skip the author of the website and write (n.d.) for no date.

Example:

(n.d.) Federation. Retrieved, February 19, 2012 from

http://www.cultureandrecreation.gov.au/articles/federation/

How to cite a picture:

Author [Surname, initial]. (date). Photograph title. Retrieved, month date, year from website address

Example:

Dalbera, J. (2009).*La tombe de Horemheb (KV.57)*. Retrieved February 17, 2014 from http://www.fotopedia.com/items/flickr-2079675065
